Last year to raise funds Marc Preston and 3 judo dads from Destination Judo scaled the dizzy heights of Kilimanjaro.

This year the Challenge for the intrepid band of coaches and dads is to cycle the length of Peru. In Nov 2015 Marc Preston, Colin Woods, Mark Poole, Steven Turnbull, Jason McEvoy, Peter Robertson and Stuart Pitt will start off from the ruins of the ancient city of Machu Pichu, cycle along the Sacred Valley of the Incas and through the Andes, before descending down into the Amazon basin and ending up in Cloud Forest. The trip will take 6 days starting at 2800m altitude and ending up in the rainforest. The first step in the journey for most of them has been to get hold of a bike and remember how to ride it!!!

All 7 are funding their own trip so that every single penny raised in support will be split equally amongst the 2 causes. The monies for Tanzania will be used to start work on a second Orphanage for another 30 children.
